

HOW TO DEAL WITH POLICE AT THE DOOR

When you are authorized to deal with the police, it's best to have at least 2 people authorized and to have 2 people respond at the door.

1. Have a pre-arranged signal that "the police are here".
2. Turn off all music.
3. Be available, reasonably sober, and get to the door quickly.
4. Be nice, but say "No" to all requests politely and firmly. If they ask, then they need permission. DO NOT give permission and DO NOT respond to threats.

Police say: "Can we come inside?"

You say: "My attorney says not to let you come inside."

Police say: "Are there underage people at this residence who are drinking?"

You say: "My attorney says not to let you come inside. I don't want to answer any questions"

Police say: "We just want to come in and make sure all is well"

You say: "My attorney says not to let you come inside. There are no problems here"

Police say: "If you don't open the door we'll break it down"

You say: "I'll come outside and talk to you" Then go outside and shut the door.

Tell police that you have an attorney and he has instructed you to deal with them in this way. Have your attorney's name, home phone number, cell phone number and business card available.
